### **Highlights of April 25, 2022 Board of Directors Meeting**

- Covid 19 Protocol Restrictions requiring proof of vaccine, wearing of masks, and limits on the number of people in restaurants and bars in British Columbia have ended. Members and guests may wear masks if they wish, but it is no longer mandatory. Hand sanitizer remains available at entrances.
- The adhesives that need to be used for the installation of wall and flooring materials for the completion of the on-course bathroom renovations require consistently warmer temperatures than we have been experiencing. Once the contractor is able to finish the walls and flooring, the rest of the renovations should be completed in relatively short order. All toilets, vanities, fixtures, etc., have been purchased and are on site ready to be installed.
- Membership numbers for the 2022 season are above 2021 so far. The final numbers will not actually be known until near the end of June, but there are very few members from last year who have not paid their dues.
- Lease of F&B Operations by Giant's Head Brewing – the agreement seems to be going well so far. Giant's Head will be making some menu changes based on customer feedback. It took some time, a lot of effort, and many hours on the phone on Jason's part, but member food and beverage pre-paid cards are now working.
- Conditions over the winter months with cold temperatures and a good blanket of snow have left the course in great shape to start the season. Early spring projects that have begun this spring include bunker edging, cart path maintenance and a new teaching area/nursery tee at the far end of the driving range. This area is being constructed using material that the District of Summerland has excavated as a result of the watermain replacement project on the roadway leading up to the golf course.
- The Board has approved the purchase of a new rough mower and bunker rake. These 2 pieces of equipment are being offered by John Deere at considerable savings. An existing tractor will be traded in to off-set the cost. This purchase, together with the equipment that was approved for purchase by the BOD in 2021, will ensure that we have reliable course grooming equipment for the foreseeable future.
